- 1. Annual Business meeting was called to order at 10:58 am by Moderator Jen Fogel.
- 2. Opening prayer was given by Rev. Tim Hall.
- 3. Roll Call Quorum was met with 27 voting members present in church.
- 4. The motion to accept the minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting was made by Peggy Grant and seconded by Bruce Barker. The motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Reports:
 - a. No questions were asked regarding the annual committee and board reports.
 - b. Treasurer's Report Carl reported on the changes in the receipts and disbursements in the various categories of the 2022 budget and in the Money Market accounts. He also explained the graph highlighting the changes in the budgets over the past 17 years. The only question asked was whether the church had considered using an online bank.
- 6. No old business.
- 7. New Business:
 - a. Proposed 2023 Church budget:

Carl Stewart, Treasurer, presented the proposed 2023 budget. He pointed out that the ministerial support account was remaining the same in the event that another part time minister might be hired before the end of the year. Under building expenses, the cost of the premium for the building and boiler insurance is actually \$13,413 rather than \$15,113 (a savings of \$1700) due to increasing the deductible from \$1000 to \$10,000. Under program expenses, the office administrator's salary was increased because of the amount of time Linda spends at the church, and the choir director's salary was decreased since the choir does not sing during the summer months. A question was asked why Zoom was not being used, and the answer was that too few people were using it; and with this new system, it is too complicated to operate. Also, the deacons need to be able to operate the system when Morgan is absent. Steve will check with Morgan to see if the service's cost has already been paid for this year. Carl recommended that we pass the budget as presented knowing that we will come in under budget. Doug Ludden made the motion to accept the proposed 2023 budget, and Peggy Grant seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

- **b.** Election of Officers: Linda Gerry asked that Ingrid Brown's name be added as an alternate delegate to the UCC Delegates. A motion by Anne Argast to accept the Slate of Nominees as presented, seconded by Linda Gerry, carried unanimously.

This structure utilizes a leadership style that combines, accountability, responsibility and authority. It would also reduce duplication of work and micromanagement, improve communication and maximize the strengths of church members. The board would consist of 9 15 members whose duties would be fiduciary, strategic (setting priorities), and generative (goal setting). This structure would also require a restructuring of the by-laws. The members felt the steering committee should review this structure, contact the UCC for help with the procedure, and bring information back to the congregation in a timely manner.

- 10. Moderator Jen Fogel declared the meeting adjourned at 11:49 am.

Annual Report of the Pastor First Congregational Church of Lincoln Rev. Tim Hall

I must admit that it seems like time has gone by in a blur since Mary Bies called me last January with the proposal that I might assist the First Congregational Church with some worship leadership. I had retired from pastoral ministry in November of 2021, and I really wasn't thinking about or planning to return to the pulpit any time soon. But there was something about that call that made me think that I was up to leading worship for a few Sundays while the church considered its next steps. Well, a few Sundays turned into few months, and Easter came and went, and a connection with the congregation began to grow in my heart. As summer approached I began to wonder if God, who had given me ample time to rest and heal after my wife Irene died, was calling me back to serve the church in a more committed way. And so discussions began, and call agreements were discussed, and on September 17th the congregation voted to extend to me a call to be your Designated Term, Part-time pastor, effective October 1st. This is a one-year commitment which may be extended, but I am more than pleased to serve you as a settled pastor here in Lincoln.

In discussing this call with the Search Committee, I listed a few things that I could offer to the church based on my background and experience. I'm pleased to have begun some of that work, including:

- Website Improvements. It was a bit concerning to see that the church website
 (www.lincolncongochurch.org) was quite seriously out-of-date when I arrived, and I set to work
 finding the keys (passwords) to gain access and make corrections. The website has now been
 completely revised, and I will continue to edit and expand the information that is available to
 people who are curious about who we are and what we do.
- Weekly Newsletter (MidweekNotes). I told the Search Committee about being a "high touch" church, that is, reaching out to communicate with members and friends on a regular basis to tell them about our ministries and accomplishments. It was quite a challenge to assemble a database of email addresses, but now there are over 85 subscribers to our electronic newsletter, Midweek Notes. It's exciting to share all that we do each week to serve God in the name of Jesus Christ.
- Broadcast presentation. The COVID pandemic caused an instant revolution on church worship
 as churches scurried to find ways to broadcast worship services via Zoom, Facebook, YouTube,
 and other platforms. The First Congregational Church has done a remarkable job with its
 Facebook platform, but there are little tweaks we have done and can still do to improve the quality
 and reliability of our broadcasts. Many thanks go to Morgan Espling for the service and technical
 expertise she brings to this project.
- Governance. Like many churches, the First Congregational Church has an extensive system of
 governance based on committees, boards, and organizations within the church, all doing tasks to
 enhance our ministries, finances, facilities, and programs. And like many churches, dwindling
 membership makes filling 50+ positions nearly impossible. I've begun some research into
 streamlining governance here in the Lincoln church, and look forward to working with you in the
 new year to begin putting concepts into action.
- Christian Education. I have been very pleased to lead an Advent "self-study" of Luke's Gospel
 account in December, and look forward to more opportunities in the new year.

As always, I look forward to working with all of you as we continue to seek God's will in our earthly pilgrimage. May God continue to bless our ministries.
